Heart drama prompts advice to cherish life

A DROITWICH councillor has thanked those who saved him following a heart attack and is looking to remind people about how precious life is.

On October 3, Wychavon District Council leader, Coun Richard Morris, woke up early and went on his usual dog walk when he began to feel unwell and started sweating.

When he arrived home, he stood in the kitchen and reached for an orange juice and the next thing he remembered was waking up in hospital.

He had collapsed in the kitchen as his heart had stopped but, luckily, his brother was on hand to call 999 and give him CPR.

He said: "A flashback to an emergency vehicle was my only knowledge that something had happened.

"I did not know what pandemonium I had caused - my brother saved my life before the first responders, ambulance, and air ambulance did their magical work.

"I feel totally blessed and fortunate, as I could have collapsed in the middle of the dog walk or a little later when I would have been driving to Evesham."

Coun Morris came around in the

hospital, asking why he was there and spent the next week in care and had an MRI scan and two stents fitted before continuing his recovery at home.

He added: "Now I attend weekly cardio rehab and am gradually getting back to some kind of normal, but accepting I must not rush things and find a suitable balance - as I'm a

give-all kind of guy.

"There is a history of heart issues in the family.

"I had walked 10,000 steps or more daily for five years, and did

morning exercise but it seems genetics can be the dominating factor."

He thanked all the emergency services and the great Worcestershire Royal cardiology Team - nurses, cleaners, porters, food preparation and doctors - who were really terrific, as well as the excellent Cardio Rehab Team.

Coun Morris now wants to set up a local support group for anyone who has experienced or is experiencing cardio issues.

He added: "As a new year dawns and plans are made, I urge everyone not to take life for granted - it is a gift to us, and we need to live with love, respect and integrity.

"I empathise with anyone who has had a heart condition as it makes you feel so vulnerable and the fragility plays with your mental health, but trust in our medical professionals and their care gives us strength, along with family and friends.

"I would like to thank everyone who has taken the time to send me cards and messages, as they have meant a lot and helped my recovery. "I'm alive and give thanks.

"Please do cherish every day with your family and friends, as you never know what is around the corner - live, love and laugh."

Site incident

THERE will be an increased police presence in Stourport over the coming days following an incident at the caravan site on Watery Lane on Sunday.

Police were called to the site around 12pm over concerns of disorder there.

Officers attended and conducted enquiries and searches throughout the day in a bid to establish exactly what happened.

Initial enquiries suggest the incident was connected to an earlier call from Kidderminster Hospital where a

man had attended with injuries which required treatment.

His injuries are not thought to be life-threatening.

It is believed those involved in the incident are known to each other.

Police said they were stepping up patrols and introducing a greater presence in the area as officers carried out further house to house and CCTV enquiries over the preceding days.

Restoration project is theme of next talk



THE NEXT talk in the Droitwich History and Archaeology Society's programme will centre on the Willow Court Restoration Project.

The presentation will be given by Tim Cornah at 7.30pm on Wednesday, January 7, in the John Corbett Room of Droitwich Spa Community Hall, Heritage Way.

It will focus on the historical farmhouse at Westlands, which for many years lay derelict and unloved, but desperately in need of saving.

Then came the Willow Court Restoration Project and the whole site was shrouded in scaffolding before the recent grand reveal.

Not only was the building brought back into use, but memories of the building were collected and an archaeological survey was undertaken to take the story right back to the beginning with documents from 1456 and evidence of a building from the late 16th century.

Tim, the guest speaker, is the archaeologist who worked on the site and he will provide an in-depth story about the site, the project, and what it means for the people of Droitwich Spa.

Everyone is welcome. Admission is £3 for members and £5 for friends and visitors.

Ideas for debut novel came to author in the form of dreams

A SOFTWARE consultant from Bromsgrove has turned his nightmares and other vivid dreams into a terrifying five-star rated debut novel.

Thomas, who admits Stephen King was his gateway into a horror addiction, added: "What begins as a rescue mission transforms into a nightmarish journey of discovery when they encounter horrors far worse than the undead hordes that plague their world.

"As they push deeper into this blood-soaked territory, they forge uneasy alliances with other survivors whilst uncovering dark secrets that challenge everything they thought they knew about survival in this brutal landscape.

"Echoes of the East is written in

the first person, to hopefully absorb the reader into the story as the protagonist."

Thomas has built up his software development business over the past 10 years and England's air ambulance service among his clients.

Although he has no plans for a sequel to his first book, he is working on drafts of similar frightening novels.

New plans set for 2026 for Bromsgrove Rovers

THE NEW chairman of Bromsgrove Rovers AFC has unveiled an ambitious five-year plan for the club's future development both on and off the pitch.

Kristian Rock recently took over as chairman of Bromsgrove Rovers AFC and has already stated he wants the first team to switch to playing non-league football.

Rovers AFC's new chairman also wants to establish a long-term base for Rovers AFC in their home town.

And Mr Rock told the Standard he wanted to build on the solid foundations already in place at the club after the tireless work done during the past four-and-a-half years since the club formed.

Mr Rock said: "Many people, including founder members Mark Whitehouse and Bryn Davies, have worked extremely hard to launch the club and then deliver the excellent progress now coming to fruition.

"We intend to build on these foundations by switching the first team over from regional to non-league football, while also establishing a long-term base for ourselves in the town.

"We have an excellent relation-

ship with Bromsgrove District Council and remain optimistic we can establish a home at Charford.

"For now, our first and reserve teams have switched to playing home fixtures at Studley Sports

and Social Club due to the costs of using our previous base, coupled to our desire to play on grass."

The club's first team currently play in Division One of the Birmingham and District

Football League, following two consecutive close-season promotions from Division Three.

Mr Rock remains assistant boss to first team manager Spencer Machin and has held the role since the club formed in 2021.

He added: "We are eager to join the Midland Football League and playing at Studley enables us to do that, as the set-up there meets the relevant criteria.

"Should the opportunity arise at the end of this season for us to enter that league then we will take it.

"Our plans will cost money to realise and we need to ensure we remain sustainable.

"The club receives a modest but vital amount of income from sales of merchandise to our growing band of supporters.

"I also encourage anyone who has heard of us, but not yet watched us, to come and see us in action."

Other funding the club receives comes from businesses through sponsorship, with Mr Rock also appealing for new sponsors to come forward and help the club achieve their ambitions.

He said: "We are also receptive to welcoming new talent onto the committee, should people have the relevant skills and experiences, or can financially back the club."

Visitors can enjoy coffee and homemade cake while their items are fixed.

At the last repair cafe on December 5, all customer donations for repairs were passed on to NewStart's pop up toy shop which ensured every child had a present to open on Christmas Day.

Julie Robinson, the repair cafe's co-ordinator, said: "The Repair Cafe isn't just about fixing broken things - it's about strengthening the community around us.

"Month after month, we've been welcomed, supported, encouraged, and cheered on by the people of Bromsgrove.

"Our customers popped in with their broken household items, enjoyed a cuppa, a chat, and the cosy pre-Christmas buzz and where able, left a small donation towards the shopping fund which we used to buy toys and selection packs which we dropped into New Starts a day or two later."

Contractors invited to apply to join framework

Wyre Forest District Council is hosting a new Worcestershire Home Adaptations Service from April 2026.

The Council is working in partnership with Bromsgrove District, Redditch Borough, Malvern Hills District, Worcester City and Wychavon District councils.

The service will provide adaptations including level access showers, ramps and extensions, enabling people to remain in their homes for longer rather than moving into residential care.

Contractors who join the framework will be carrying out work that makes a real difference to people's lives, helping them maintain their independence and quality of life.

The council is looking for skilled professionals who can deliver high-quality installations and are committed to supporting residents.

Multiple contractors will be appointed for each type of work to ensure flexibility and timely delivery across the county.

Successful contractors will need to meet quality standards, demonstrate technical expertise, provide case examples of previous work, and agree to the council's code of conduct.

A set price schedule applies for level access showers, ramps and associated works, while larger projects such as extensions and conversions will be quoted individually.

Redditch Borough Council's executive board member for housing, Coun Bill Hartnett, said: "By pooling resources we can ensure we provide a quality and efficient service to help our more vulnerable residents live independently for as long as possible."

Contractors interested in joining the framework should email wyreforest.procurement@wyreforestdc.gov.uk to request the registration link.

They will receive a guide on how to register and submit details for consideration.

The closing date for submissions is 12pm on Monday January 19.

'Family Farm Tax threshold rise does not go far enough' - MP

THE MPs for Bromsgrove and Droitwich have both called on the government to 'do the right thing' and scrap the planned 'Family Farm Tax.'

Bradley Thomas (Bromsgrove) and Nigel Huddleston (Droitwich and Evesham) both voted against the new inheritance tax laws, which would impact more than 75 per cent of farms across the country.

Currently, farmland is exempt from inheritance tax under a policy called 'Agricultural Property Relief' (APR). Chancellor Rachel Reeves has announced she will end that exemption.

But, prior to Christmas, the Government rowed back on its initial plan which would have meant, from April 2026, a 20 per cent tax would apply to agricultural assets over £1million. That threshold has now been increased to £2.5million.

The government said the number of estates claiming agricultural property relief (including those also claiming business relief) affected by the reforms in 2026/27 would now halve from 375 to 185.

But Mr Thomas claimed the tax would still be devastating for family farms and pose a serious risk to domestic food security and food prices.

He added the Government's political choice to target farmers was a cruel blow to the industry and said, whilst the increased threshold was welcomed, it did not go far enough.

"After over a year of pressure from farmers across the country and MPs from across the House of the Commons the Government has finally done a partial U-turn on the Family Farm Tax.

"Official figures show the UK has 6,270 fewer farms since this disastrous policy was announced and this shows the devastating impact that Labour is having on the farming sector.

"Announced just before Christmas the timing of this is deliberate and it has almost certainly been announced now to prevent scrutiny during the busy Christmas and New Year period. But this isn't enough.

"The whole tax needs to be axed 'Inheritance tax is wrong.'

Mr Huddleston said the Finance Bill implemented sweeping changes to Agricultural Property Relief (APR) and Business Property Relief (BPR) and, despite clear warnings from farmers, the 'tax' would now move to the next legislative stage.

He added the Conservatives have campaigned strongly against the Family Farm Tax but the party's 'reasoned amendment to stop it which Labour rejected.

Mr Huddleston MP called the legislation a 'cruel and unnecessary



blow to farmers, rural communities, and food producers across Worcestershire and beyond'.

"This tax threatens family farms, undermines food security, and will push up prices for consumers."

He pointed out there were 738 farms in Wychavon District and thousands more across the country and warned the policy could lead to irreversible damage.

We contacted Mr Huddleston, as soon as the Government announced it was raising the threshold to £2.5million. But he had not got back to us at the time of going to press.

They're ready for the next level

WORCESTERSHIRE Acute Hospitals NHS Trust (WAHT) has welcomed its first group of T-Level students from Worcester Sixth Form College (WSFC) and Heart of Worcestershire College (HoW) to gain practical experience in healthcare.

The course combines classroom learning with industry placements, preparing students for careers in healthcare or further study, including university.

Over the two-year T-Level in Health course, the equivalent to three A Levels, students spend a significant amount of time in hospitals as part of an industry placement.

A total of 29 students will be spending nine weeks across the trust's hospitals – Worcestershire Royal, Alexandra in Redditch, and Kidderminster Hospital and

Treatment Centre.

During their placements, they will learn about different healthcare roles and day-to-day work in the NHS.

The programme is being supported by the WAHT Education Academy and Widening Participation Team.

Abi Wardlaw, first-year student at HoW College, said: "Over the last few days I've been shadowing a healthcare assistant on the frailty ward, and the ward manager has arranged for me to spend time with a physiotherapist so I can see more of what they do."

"It's been really inspiring, and it's exactly why I chose the T-Level route - it gives you the chance to experience different roles and find the one that feels right for you."

Khadeeja Qubra, student at WSFC, has undertaken her placement so far at the Worcestershire Royal Hospital and said: "I chose to do a T-Level

because we get to apply our learning from college in a real hospital setting."

"The staff are so welcoming, and I feel like I'm already part of the team."

"My favourite part of the placement is speaking to the patients – I love it."

Both colleges involved in the programme have praised the placements.

Rachel Briggs, the WSFC course lead, said: "We are delighted and very grateful to have the opportunity to work in partnership with the trust in supporting our T-Level Health students."

"These placements allow students to work alongside experienced and specialist NHS staff to gain valuable practical experience, helping to bridge the gap between theoretical study and real world application

which best prepares them for future employment within their chosen fields."

Mo Haran, HoW College vice principal, added: "It's been excellent to launch the new T-Level course which is helping to bridge the skills gap in the health industry."

"We are so proud of the students enrolled on the course and are blown away by their dedication and commitment to their studies and future careers - all of the students have settled so well and been ingrained into their teams which is fantastic to hear."

By offering T-Level placements, WAHT is nurturing local talent and building a strong, sustainable talent pipeline for the years ahead.

The trust is also supporting the wider effort to address the skills shortage in healthcare and helping students make informed decisions

about their future careers.

Hayley Flavell, chief nursing officer for WAHT, said: "These placements provide an excellent opportunity for students to see a wide variety of healthcare roles and experience the NHS in action."

T-Levels are a crucial stepping stone for students, paving the way to permanent employment or further study.

Funding helps support project

New service is all set to pull in

NEXT year - 2026 - will be a massive year for the nation's railway services.

The new Great British Railways brand was unveiled earlier this month as landmark legislation was debated in the commons.

The aim is to get one railway brought back into public ownership to deliver a more reliable network.

Those who have been a regular rail commuter or even just used trains for leisure, will have had your fair share of delays, cancellations and extortionate fees to get where you need to be.

Hopefully all that will change.

A new GBR ticketing app will allow people to buy tickets without booking fees - and this comes after the government's freeze on rail fares to put money back in passengers' pockets.

The GBR ticketing app will be a one-stop shop for passengers to check train times and buy tickets at the best prices across the rail network without any booking fees.

Disabled passengers will also be able to use the app to book Passenger Assist when buying tickets, creating a seamless experience.

Up and down the country, the consensus is clear - the railway needs to improve.

That is why the government is bringing train operators back into public ownership to reform a fragmented system.

Seven major train operators are already in public hands, covering a third of all passenger journeys in Great Britain.

The logo and train livery for GBR will be rolled out from spring 2026 to trains, websites, stations and more - bringing the railway together under one brand owned by the public, delivering for the public, not for private shareholders.

The new brand

The design features a red, white and blue colour scheme and sharp angles to create a striking and memorable design mirroring the Union Flag.

The GBR logo has also been revealed, featuring the iconic double arrow symbol in a nod to Britain's proud railway heritage.

The landmark Railways Bill follows the government's decision to freeze rail fares for the first time in 30 years to put money back in passengers' pockets and ease the cost of living for hard-working people.

The bill will create Great British Railways, which will bring together 17 different organisations, cut through the frustrating bureaucracy and lack of accountability that continues to plague the railways and instead run Britain's railways as a single organisation for the first time in decades.

GBR will maintain and improve the railways, accountable to passengers, freight customers and taxpayers.

Fares and ticketing will be brought into the 21st century (including with the new app), a strengthened passenger watchdog will investigate poor service and demand improvement, and GBR will be empowered

to build a railway that supports the government's missions to drive economic growth and opportunity by unlocking jobs and housing.

A railway for everyone

Transport Secretary Heidi Alexander said the future of Britain's railways was under way

"I'm immensely proud to unveil the new look for Great British Railways as we deliver landmark legislation to nationalise our trains and reform the railway so it better serves passengers.

"This isn't just a paint job - it represents a new railway, casting off the frustrations of the past and focused entirely on delivering a proper public service for passengers.

"With fares frozen, a bold new look and fundamental reforms becoming law, we are building a railway Britain can rely on and be proud of.

Jacqueline Starr, Executive Chair and CEO of Rail Delivery Group, said: "The Railways Bill presents an opportunity to bring the industry together with a single focus on

delivering for our customers and we are determined to play our part in getting it right.

"As the industry evolves, our priority remains supporting the rail network to keep people moving and making sure we are delivering a better railway for everyone across the country, now and in the future.

"We welcome the government's commitment to improving the services our customers depend on every day and we will continue to work closely with industry partners to support a smooth transition to Great British Railways."

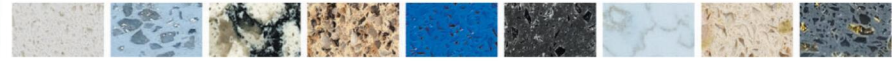

However, nostalgia is also making a comeback, with Gen Z diners championing retro comfort classics

like bangers and mash and prawn cocktail as dishes they'd love to see on menus of restaurants in 2026.

One of the most surprising food trends for next year? Sharing plates are becoming less popular as 56 per cent of Brits prefer individual servings.

Brits expect to see fried chicken, gourmet burgers, protein-packed dishes, and espresso-based drinks taking centre stage in 2026.

Different ways to ring in 2026

Buddhist temples ring their bells 108 times at midnight in the traditional Joya no Kane.

The rings represent the 108 elements of hono, mental states that lead Japanese to take unwholesome actions.

New Year's Eve in Colombia is a vibrant and diverse celebration, blending traditions, superstitions, and family customs to welcome the upcoming year with positivity and hope.

New Year's Eve is a time for personal gatherings and community revelry. Many Colombians host house parties, where friends and family come together to share in



the festivities.

In the tranquil countryside, communities come alive with vibrant street-party-style celebrations.

A hallmark tradition involves the creation of El Año Viejo, a scarecrow symbolizing the old year, which is placed atop a bonfire filled with fireworks and as the effigy burns, it signifies the cleansing of the past and welcoming new beginnings. Colombia's New Year's customs are steeped in superstitions and age-old traditions, each carrying its own symbolism and significance.

In Spain they eat grapes at the stroke of midnight.

Tradition has it that people have

to eat them one by one, in time with the striking of the clock at midnight on December 31.

Those who manage to eat all the grapes in time, are said to be in for a year of prosperity and good luck.

In many towns and villages people go to a central square or an iconic place where there is a large clock, to eat the grapes together and share the last minutes of the old year.

In Spain tradition says those who eat 12 grapes in time with the striking clock are in for a year of prosperity and good luck.

Looking back at gym trends of old

AFTER an indulgent Christmas, many people want to get fit in the New Year.

And, believe it or not, exercising is far from a modern phenomenon. From prehistoric times when it was a matter of survival, through the Renaissance when fencing and horse back riding were all the rage, to early 20th century "fitness for the masses", people have always been intent on keeping trim.

A more in depth look into how different eras approached exercise may help inspire that illusive New Year fitness regime.

Prehistoric Era (Before 3000 BCE)

Fitness was all about survival and functionality.

Activities would have included hunting, gathering, climbing, running and lifting heavy objects.

Ancient Civilizations (3000 BCE to 500 CE)

Egyptians were into military training, swimming, and dancing. Physical fitness was often tied to religious or ceremonial practices.

Greeks had a highly formalized approach to fitness. There were gymnasiums for wrestling, running, discus and javelin.

The focus was on balance of mind and body.

For the Romans, fitness was focused on being soldiers and gladiators. Training included marching, weight training, swimming, and combat skills.

Middle Ages (500 to 1500 CE)

Fitness was functional for work or combat. Activities included sword fighting, horseback riding, archery and heavy manual labor.

The nobility focused on training for tournaments, while for peasants' daily work, such as

farming, maintained fitness.

Renaissance and Early Modern Period (1500 to 1800)

There was a resurgence of physical culture inspired by classical Greek ideals. Activities included fencing, dance, gymnastics and horseback riding.

The philosophy of fitness was linked to education, beauty, and discipline.

19th Century

Fitness was impacted by the Industrial Revolution: Sedentary lifestyles increased and urbanization reduced manual labor.

There was, however, a rise in organized sports such as track and field, gymnastics, swimming and rowing, as well as fitness pioneers like Friedrich Ludwig Jahn, the father of modern gymnastics.

Early 20th Century (1900 to 1950)

Fitness movements like aerobics, calisthenics, and gymnastics gained popularity. Physical culture magazines popularized weight training.

Notable figures were bodybuilding pioneer Eugen Sandow and Jack LaLanne, known for "fitness for the masses".

There was also a public health focus as Governments encouraged fitness for military readiness and public health.

Mid to Late 20th Century (1950 to 1990)

Fitness became recreational, not just functional.

There was an aerobics and cardio



explosion, while running, cycling, and swimming became mainstream.

Jane Fonda's aerobics videos in the 1980s popularized home workouts. Weight training became widely popular for both men and women.

Fitness as lifestyle gained traction with gyms, health clubs, and group classes becoming commonplace.

Late 20th Century to Early 21st Century (1990 to 2010)

There was a real diversification of fitness trends. Yoga and Pilates became popular for flexibility and core strength, CrossFit, boot

camp, and functional training for high-intensity workouts.

Running and cycling marathons became social and community events.

Modern Era (2010 to present)

Fitness is now seen as a lifestyle. There is an emphasis on holistic wellness, mental health, nutrition, and recovery.

Inclusivity and diversity is at the forefront with programs for all ages, body types, and abilities.

Influencers and online communities drive trends.

Feet up, eyes closing and brain definitely in the lowest gear you can find - the last thing you need is something to distract you from the hard graft of just simply relaxing.

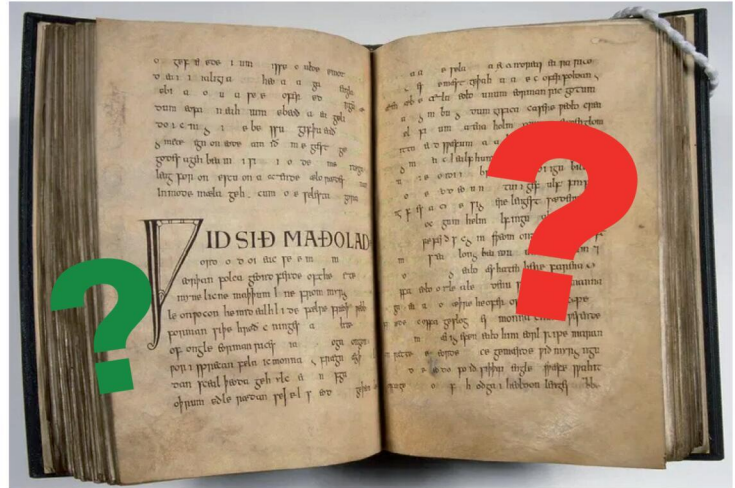
But for years we've seen this post-feast period of physical and mental downtime as being the perfect time to fire up the mind and get the reasoning machinery in order.

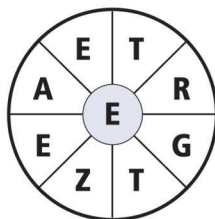

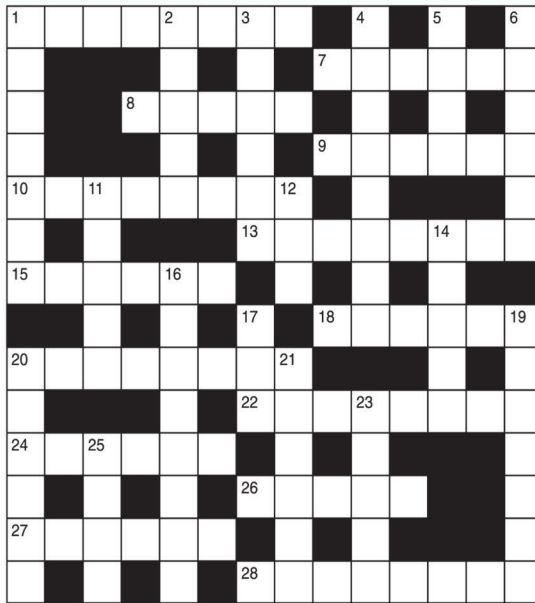

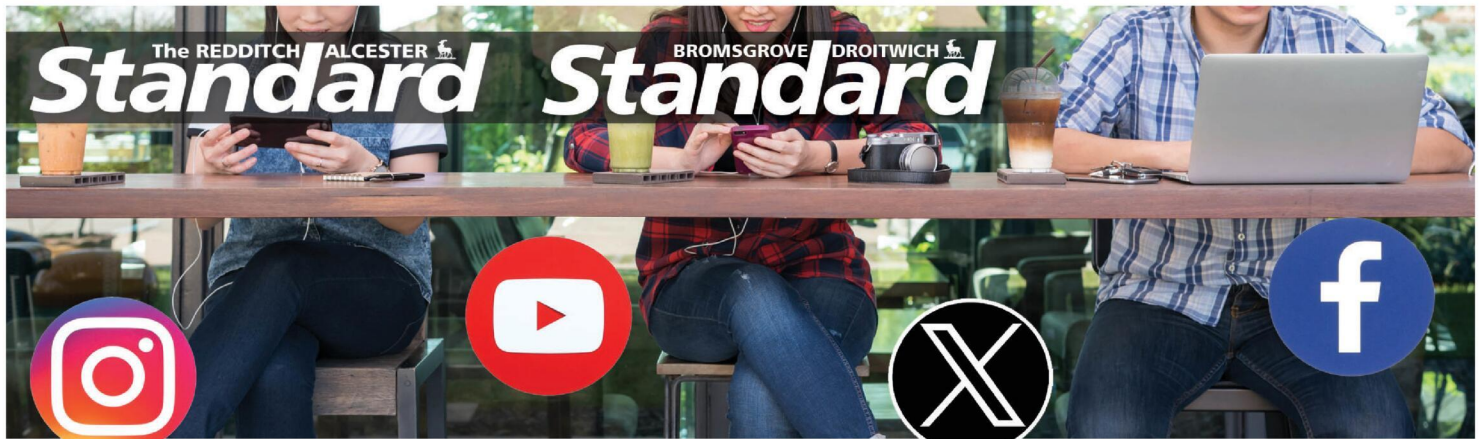

FOOTBALL: A BRACE from Alex Dugmore inspired Droitwich Spa to a 4-2 derby win against Worcester Raiders.

The Saltmen returned to winning ways in a six-goal thriller as Ben Tilbury's early penalty put Spa ahead at the King George Playing Fields.

Raiders responded soon after courtesy of Prince Henry's penalty only for Dugmore to restore the home side's lead before the break.

A goal from Josh Hurdman extended Spa's lead early in the second period before Lincoln Hunt kept Raiders in the contest.

However, Dugmore struck again late on to seal the points for Andy Crowther's side as the club ended the year on a high.

The result means Droitwich sit third in the Hellenic League Premier Division table, five points behind leaders Roman

Glass St George with three games in hand.

However, second-placed Slimbridge have two games in-hand on Spa and five games in-hand on table toppers Roman and currently sit one point above the Saltmen in the table.

Spa exacted revenge on Worcester after suffering defeat against Raiders in the Worcestershire Senior Cup earlier this season.

And the Saltmen made the perfect start when Raiders goalkeeper Charlie Emery brought down Hurdman in the box and Tilbury converted the resulting penalty after just two minutes.

However, Worcester equalised five minutes later with a penalty of their own as Henry converted from the spot after the ball struck a Droitwich arm in the box following a corner.

The teams traded chances soon after as Emery denied Jack Brighton while Joe Stockton kept out Cam Monteith's effort at the other end.

Spa reclaimed the lead on 35

minutes when Dugmore planted a trademark header into the net after he rose highest to meet a corner.

The home side went close to another goal before the break as Hurdman saw his free-kick travel narrowly wide.

And Emery then tipped Cory Rudd's drive from 20-yards out around the post to keep Raiders in the contest.

The hosts extended their lead three minutes after the break as Hurdman rounded Emery and finished into an empty net.

Worcester responded on 70 minutes when Emery's long kick looper over the Spa defence and substitute Hunt rolled a shot into the bottom corner past a hesitant Stockton.

However, Spa made sure of the points on 82 minutes as Dugmore headed in his second of the game after good work from James Lemon down the left.

Droitwich are next in action against Hallen on Saturday, January 3 with kick-off at 3pm at the Hallen Centre.
