£40m move will bring new places at schools

HUNDREDS of new school places will be available in Warwickshire under a £40million plan unveiled by Warwickshire County Council.

The council's cabinet has agreed a series of additions to its Education Capital Programme for 2025-26, paving the way for hundreds of new school places, improvements to facilities, and expanded provision for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

The plans come in response to recent population growth and the impact of new housing developments across the county.

Among the proposals is a £31million expansion of Avon Valley School in Rugby, which will provide 300 additional secondary places, a new sports hall, further curriculum space and 20 new specialist resourced SEND places.

New specialist SEND resource provision will be funded at Holy Trinity CofE Primary School in Stratford, costing £60,000.

A £155,000 investment will fund the amalgamation of Henry Hinde Infant School and Henry Hinde Junior School in Rugby. Further expansions will take place at schools in Nuneaton, Bedworth and Atherstone.

Much of the investment will be

funded by developer contributions secured through Section 106 agreements, alongside Basic Need funding, High Needs capital, and the Council's Capital Investment Fund.

WCC education spokesman Coun Wayne Briggs said: "These schemes will create the right capacity in the right locations as our communities grow, while also expanding specialist resourced provision to offer more support for children with SEND."

"This investment continues the significant progress made over recent years to grow and strengthen education provision across the county."

Finance and property spokesman Coun Stephen Shaw said the proposals were a 'sound and strategic' investment in Warwickshire's future.

He added: "We are making prudent use of developer contributions and education capital funding, while managing the financial risks associated with forward-funding where required."

Warwickshire's school-age population has grown in the past decade, with 15 new schools opened since 2015. Forecasts indicate continued growth linked to large-scale housing developments - particularly in Rugby, Nuneaton, Bedworth, and surrounding areas.

Demand for specialist SEND provision has also risen, with the number of pupils with Education, Health and Care Plans increasing by nine per cent annually over the past five years.

Charity highlights plight of 'trapped'

ELDERLY people are being trapped in homes that are unsuitable for later life.

So says Age UK Coventry & Warwickshire which is sounding the alarm after new national research revealed older people were living in homes that were inaccessible, unaffordable, or simply unsuitable for later life.

The report, Late Movers, released recently by Age UK, shows nearly half of over-50s were worried about whether they could afford to live safely and comfortably as they aged.

With step-free, age-friendly homes in short supply, many Coventry and Warwickshire residents are left facing declining health, isolation, and increased risk of injury in homes that no longer meet their needs.

Scott Collins, at Age UK Coventry & Warwickshire, said: "Every week, we hear from older people across Coventry and Warwickshire who want to downsize, or move closer to support, but just can't find or afford anywhere suitable."

"This isn't just a housing issue, it's about health, independence,

and dignity in later life."

The key survey findings showed 44 per cent of over-50s worried about affording a suitable home, and 41 per cent were concerned about the condition of their current property.

Only 12 per cent of homes in England have basic accessibility features like step-free access. Many older people face delays of months or years for adaptations such as handrails, stair lifts, or

accessible bathrooms. Over half of those aged 66 plus have not moved home since turning 50, despite growing needs.

Scott added: "The charity is calling for more age-friendly homes across Warwickshire and Coventry, and faster support to adapt the homes people already live in. With an ageing population, this should be a priority for planners, developers, and local authorities."

Detectorist shares 'thrill' of finding piece of history

A METAL detectorist has described the 'thrill' of unearthing an early medieval relic on the edge of a farmer's field in Warwickshire.

Kathy Bonehill was relatively new to the hobby when she discovered the near complete copper-alloy chape – a decorative tip to a dagger's scabbard – which dates back some 1500 years.

The chape, found near Rugby, has been declared a 'find of note' by the British Museum's Portable Antiquities Scheme, which keeps a record of archaeology finds in England and Wales.

It has now gone on display in Rugby Art Gallery and Museum's archaeology gallery after Kathy donated the chape, thought to be of Viking origin, to the museum's collection.

Reliving her discovery earlier this year, Kathy said: "I've been metal detecting in the Warwickshire countryside with a regular group for a couple of years, uncovering some fascinating items along the way, yet nothing compares to this stunning dagger chape.

"I found it on the very edge of a farmer's field in Kings Newnham. At first, it was clagged with dirt, its beautiful detail hidden beneath layers of grime.

"Only after an hour of patient work with a wooden cocktail stick did the design begin to emerge - and I realised I was holding something truly special, perhaps even unique.

"There's a thrill in moments like this. The slow reveal of craftsmanship long buried, the sense of connection to lives lived centuries ago."

The chape's decorative design features a human face flanked by a pair of birds – possibly representing Odin, the chief god in Norse mythology, and his ravens, Huginn

and Muninn.

Ring-and-dot motifs run along the lower edge of both birds and vertically through the 'body' of the human form.

Weighing just nine grams, the chape is 3.5cm long, 2.5cm wide, and just under 1cm thick at its widest part.

Rugby Borough Council spokesperson Coun Maggie O'Rourke said: "We're delighted Kathy has chosen to donate this stunning find to the

museum's local history collection so we can share it with visitors to Rugby Art Gallery and Museum.

"It's amazing how much history lies undiscovered in our borough, with Kathy's generous donation coming hot on the heels of the museum's acquisition of a medieval brooch discovered by a metal detectorist in a field near Birdingbury, thanks to a grant from the Arts Council England/V&A Purchase Grant Fund."

Project goes full circle as new shop and hub opens its doors

A CHARITY that supports vulnerable women has opened a new shop and hub in Leamington – at the place where the project was first conceived nine years ago.

Volunteers and guests gathered to mark the launch of the pre-loved shop, women's hub, workspace and counselling room which has been 18 months in the planning.

The unit, in Gloucester Street, is an extension of The Esther Project, a CIC established by Lianne Kirkman in 2023, followed by Esther House, a seven-bed supported living accommodation. A new drop-off point on the same street has also opened to help keep the shop stocked with pre-loved goods.

The space, the original home of the early concept Esther Group in 2016, can offer a full programme of support, training, and employability opportunities - from counselling sessions in the dedicated therapy room, to creative workshops and trauma-informed courses in the hub, and barista training and cooking classes in the kitchen. The women can also gain hands-on retail and customer service experience as supported volunteers in the pre-loved shop, helping them build confidence and new skills for the future.

Cutting the ribbon on both the shop and hub spaces were Warwickshire's lord lieutenant Tim Cox, deputy lieutenant Clare Sawdon and high sheriff Karen Lynch.

Mr Cox said: "We are very keen to support what Lianne and the fundraising team are doing. Thank you to the volunteers and everyone whose help has meant we have the

foundations now for this project and we need to make sure it continues to grow."

Lianne's mission is to create, nurture and empower a community where every woman can heal, grow and reach their future potential. It does this through a range of services, including counselling, one-on-one support, creative activities, employability opportunities, and drop-in sessions. Esther House offers vulnerable women a safe space to recover.

Lianne added: "This marks a meaningful return to the very building where The Esther Group first began back in 2016, making the launch feel like a true homecoming. The hub has been created as a women-only space offering vital access to support, group workshops and therapeutic counselling. It will also provide hands-on opportunities for women to gain confidence and build skills in retail, barista work, baking, sewing and other skills."

The Esther Project is a gender-specific initiative supporting women facing mental health challenges, escaping domestic abuse, recovering from addiction, transitioning from prison, or experiencing homelessness.

Until now, The Esther Project has operated primarily through a weekly drop-in session at All Saints Parish Church each Monday, alongside remote support, workshops, and training delivered off-site.

A timetable of courses is being planned including Kintsugi, yoga, skincare, trauma courses and wellbeing sessions.

The shop and drop-off points, at number 6 and 12 Gloucester Street, are open between 10am and 4pm, Tuesdays to Saturdays.

‘You will forever be our guiding star’ say family of crash victim

THE FAMILY of a ‘hardworking and determined’ dad who died in a crash on the M6 last month have paid tribute to him.

Tomasz, 47, from Northamptonshire, died following a collision on the M6 on Monday December 8.

In a heartfelt tribute, his family said: “Tomasz was more than just a father, partner, son, brother and uncle – he was a beacon of love, strength, and devotion.

“He lived every day with purpose, pouring his heart into his partner, his children, and his family. His selflessness knew no bounds; he gave without expecting anything in return, always putting others before himself.

“His happiness was contagious, and his presence brought warmth and comfort to everyone around him. He was the kind of friend who stood by you through thick and thin, and the kind of community member who lifted others up without hesitation.

“Hardworking and determined, he carried his responsibilities with grace, never complaining, always smiling, and always finding joy in the simple moments.

“His laughter lit up rooms, his kindness touched countless lives,

and his unwavering support lifted friends and communities he supported.

“He was the one people turned to for guidance, encouragement, and

comfort.

“A role model in every sense, he showed us what it means to live with integrity, strength, compassion, and endless love.

“Though his life was tragically cut short, his spirit remains a bright light that will never fade.

“We will remember him not for the way he left us, but for the way

he lived – with love, happiness, selflessness generosity, and devotion.

“His legacy is etched into our hearts and hearts of those who were lucky enough to have known him, and his example will continue to inspire us to be better, love harder, and live fuller.

“He will live on in the laughter of his children, the strength of his family, and the love that binds us all together.

“Rest peacefully our beloved Tomasz. You will forever be our guiding star.”

Detectives continue to appeal for witnesses and information to help with their investigation into the collision.

On Monday December 8 at around 6.30pm, Tomasz stopped his red HGV on the hard shoulder between junctions 1 and 2 on the northbound M6.

A short time later, the driver of a white Scania HGV with a blue curtain-sided trailer is believed to have driven into the red HGV.

Police would like to hear from anyone who may have been on or near the M6 who may have seen, or recorded dashcam footage of, the white Scania HGV prior to the collision.

New film to put spotlight on Bard

THE SHAKESPEARE Birthplace Trust (SBT) is hoping the big screen could give the Bard a visitor boost.

The soon-to-be-released *Hamnet*, based on the novel by Maggie O'Farrell and starring Jessie Buckley and Paul Mescal, showcases a number of historic buildings in the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust's care, including The Birthplace and Anne Hathaway's Cottage.

And to celebrate, SBT is joining forces with Everyman Cinema for a special *Hamnet* event including film screening and pre-screening Q&A with special guests. It will take place at Stratford Everyman Cinema on January 9.

Hamnet Shakespeare, twin to Judith, was the only son of William Shakespeare and Anne Hathaway. He tragically died aged just 11 and was buried in the churchyard at Holy Trinity in Stratford on August 11 1596.

Rachael North, chief executive of the SBT,

said: "We hope the film inspires more people to come and walk in Anne, William and Hamnet's footsteps so they can experience first-hand the love and loss that is at the heart of their story. Maggie O'Farrell herself was inspired by visiting The Birthplace and exploring the family's personal story and we hope our buildings offer all our visitors' moments which are inspiring and revelatory."

"As well as bringing to life the stories of the Shakespeare family, the film brings the cottage to life as an historical building which has stood for centuries and of which we are all proud custodians. The cottage, and the story of *Hamnet*, give us the human side of Shakespeare, Anne and their own family, and it will be wonderful to see that play out on the big screen."

While not filmed in Stratford, Anne Hathaway's Cottage, built more than 500 years ago with much of the original building surviving, is a major focus in the film.

Hamnet reimagines the families, landscapes and influences of home that became so fundamental to Shakespeare's work.

Prof Charlotte Scott, from the SBT, added: "Maggie O'Farrell's novel, and its subsequent adaptation for stage and film, demonstrates the enduring fascination of Shakespeare's life and the real and imagined experiences that influenced his future and his art."

Further details on the special screening event will be announced in the coming weeks.

Daniel's career takes off

A FORMER performing arts student from Stratford College is flying high in his career after starring in *Wendy and Peter Pan* with the Royal Shakespeare Company.

Daniel Krikler, who studied musical theatre at the college from 2007 to 2009, took on the title role of Peter Pan at the Barbican Theatre in London.

Daniel was destined for a performance career after falling in love with the stage at a young age. He joined a local youth theatre group and dance school and his passion for it grew.

He knew the best chance of getting into drama school was to continue to study, so chose Stratford College as his training ground.

Following his time at college, Daniel went to the prestigious Laine Theatre Arts for three years, before later studying a master's

degree in acting at Central School of Speech and Drama.

Since training, Daniel has performed in several productions. He fondly remembers Musical Loserville which transferred to the West End, and his first play *Pink Mist*.

Now Daniel is to sprinkle himself with fairy dust and fly to Neverland.

He said: "I grew up just outside Coventry and would cycle for over an hour to the RSC to watch shows. I remember cycling home afterwards along country roads with my mind full of these incredible characters I'd just seen. So to work with that company all these years later on such a magical show and character feels really extraordinary."

"Just being paid to do what you loved felt crazy. There's always that little voice in your head that tells you you'll probably never get a job, so to land these roles, it's pretty great."

Timetable changes set for 2026

CHANGES are coming to several bus services linking Coventry and Warwickshire.

From Friday January 2, Stagecoach will take over a number of routes in the Coventry, Nuneaton, Bedworth and Rugby areas after contracts with current operators National Express, Arriva, and Coventry Minibuses come to an end.

Later in 2026, new electric buses will be introduced across these routes when vehicle deliveries are complete.

Coun Jennifer Warren, Warwickshire County Council's spokesperson for Transport and Planning, said: "These changes mark an important step in keeping Warwickshire's bus network reliable, connected and fit for the future."

"In bringing these routes under new contracts and preparing for the introduction of modern electric vehicles later in the year, we are working to ensure that residents across the county can continue to depend on regular, accessible and high-quality public transport."

"We are grateful to our outgoing operators for their service and look forward to working with Stagecoach as these improvements are introduced."

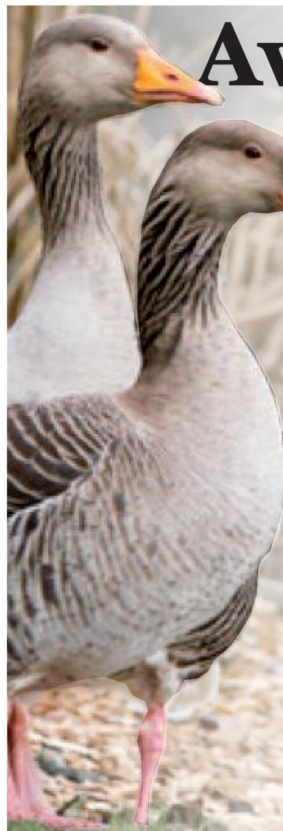

Avian 'flu warning issued to public

Risk of transfer to humans is low

PEOPLE are being urged not to touch sick or dead birds after avian influenza was found in Stratford.

The Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) and the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) confirmed 'bird flu' had been recorded in a number of geese along the River Avon.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), Warwickshire County Council and Stratford District Council is working with APHA to manage the situation and protect public health and the risk to other birds.

The A(H5N1) strain is highly infectious to other birds, but the risk to human health is considered very low. But it is vital people do not touch sick birds or bird carcasses, to avoid the need to introduce further infection control measures.

The outbreak in Stratford follows confirmed reports

earlier this month of bird flu in wild bird populations at Kingsbury Water Park in north Warwickshire.

As well as not touching or picking up any dead or sick birds, people are also being urged to stick to footpaths and keep dogs on leads, not to handle feathers or any surfaces that may be contaminated by droppings and to thoroughly wash hands after visiting affected areas.

Dr Shade Agboola, director of public health at Warwickshire County Council, said: "The incidence of avian flu in the wild bird population is something that we are taking very seriously.

Risk

"The UKHSA has made it clear that the risk of the disease transferring from birds to humans is considered to be very low. To ensure this situation remains, members of the public should not touch or go near sick or dying birds and any dead birds found should be reported to Defra."

Mamoonah Tahir, consultant in health protection leading on avian influenza for UKHSA

West Midlands, added: "The risk to the public from this strain of avian flu is very low, however it is important that people do not touch any sick or dead birds.

"As a precaution, anyone who may have come into contact with the droppings or with birds in an area where the infection has been confirmed will be monitored and offered a course of antiviral medication if needed."

Anyone who has come into contact with sick or dead birds or their droppings, in an area where the infection has been confirmed, is urged to notify the UKHSA's West Midlands Health Protection Team on 0344 225 3560 so public health experts can determine if antiviral medication and active surveillance of their condition is necessary.

It is likely that avian flu is circulating more widely than Stratford. If anyone sees sick or dead birds by waterways or on private land in the surrounding areas of Warwickshire, they should not touch them and should call the Defra helpline on 03459 33 55 77.

Housebuilder boosts foodbank resources

Laura Bisbey, planning director at HarperCrewe, said: "We are aware from the work that The Trussell Trust does that every day there are parents who skip meals to feed their children.

"We also know from the Warwick District Foodbank that many local people are forced to choose between paying the rent or eat-

ing. As the Foodbank warehouse is so close to our headquarters, we are proud to support the charity and this important initiative, which brings home how a small donation each day can soon add up to 75kg in donations, which we hope will make a difference to local families this Christmas."

Warwick District Foodbank is seeing increasing demand as people struggle to make ends, leaving a shortfall between the donations coming in and the food going out. It means the foodbank is having to buy food each week in order to meet its demand.

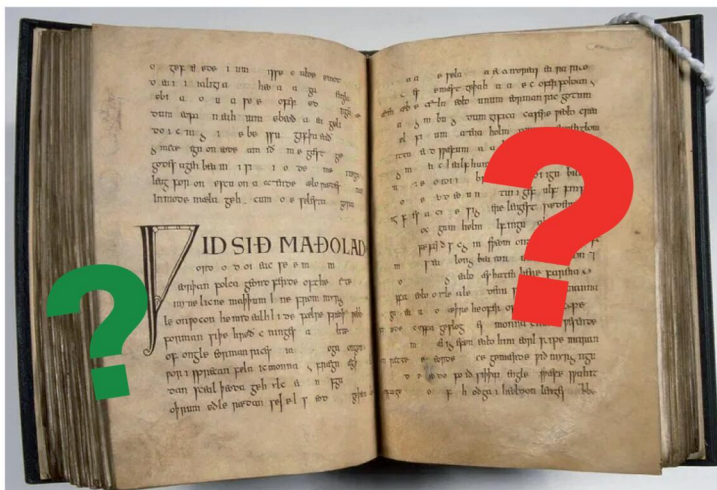
Feet up, eyes closing and brain definitely in the lowest gear you can find - the last thing you need is something to distract you from the hard graft of just simply relaxing.

Police warn of fake notes

FAKE banknotes have been used in Lutterworth to buy items advertised for sale on social media.

Between November 8 and December 9, Leicestershire Police received 15 reports of counterfeit money being handed over by people collecting items they had agreed to buy via Facebook Marketplace.

The incidents took place in Lutterworth, Loughborough, Hinckley and Leicester – most of which involving the sale of high-value mobile phones.

In all but one of the incidents, the buyer left the location before the seller had the opportunity to check the notes that had been handed over.

Nicole McIntyre from Leicestershire Police's Economic Crime Unit, said: "At this time of year, I know people will be selling things that could be bought as a Christmas present by others.

"If you're selling something on social media and are meeting a buyer in person, please check the bank notes you're given. I'd encourage you to do this before handing any items over.

"Sites like eBay and Vinted also offer the seller protection and can be considered as an alternative way of selling any unwanted items."

Bringing young people into work should be priority for business

THERE is a dire need to support young people into employment and training, says a Coventry and Warwickshire business chief.

The latest unemployment figures show a 5.1 per cent rise in the UK, with a significant increase in the number of 18 to 24-year-olds who are unemployed.

Corin Crane, chief executive of Coventry and Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce, said: "Labour costs are proving to be a huge pressure point for businesses across our region and, with that being reflected across the country, it comes as no surprise that unemployment has ticked up again.

"There is a particular concern around young people and it's right that the Government channels much of its efforts in that direction.

"We welcome the focus on supporting the unemployed back into work and especially the drive to promote apprenticeships and offer free places for under 24s to local SMEs because it's vitally important for our future economy that we bring through the next generation of workforce into the world of work.

"That said, we also need to see a wider drive to get the



economy growing again by giving businesses the confidence to invest because that will lead to job creation.

"There were lots of businesses putting plans on hold ahead of the Budget and I am cautiously optimistic that they might start to move forward

with those in the New Year."

Jane Gratton, deputy director of Public Policy at the British Chambers of Commerce, added: "The latest data paints a gloomy picture for jobs, opportunities and growth. It reflects what businesses tell us – they are less confident

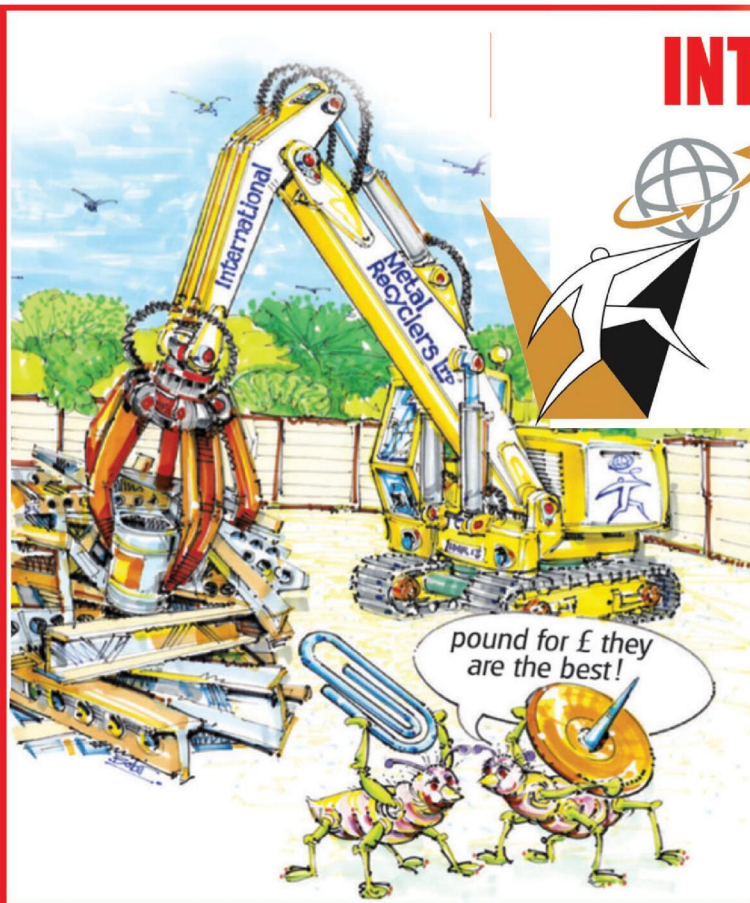
about hiring staff due to sky-high employment costs and a tidal wave of new employment legislation coming down the track.

"While there has been some easing of cost pressures - with average earnings including bonuses slowing to 4.7 per cent in the three months to October - labour costs remain a challenge. Nearly three quarters (72 per cent) of businesses in our latest survey said labour costs are the biggest cost pressure they are facing.

"There is a limit to how much additional cost firms can absorb without an impact on investment and growth. The further increase in unemployment, hitting 5.1 per cent in October, is also a clear sign of the sluggish economy.

"We need a laser like focus on stimulating growth and boosting investment, trade, innovation and skills. The Government must work in partnership with business to make 2026 a year of delivery."

Corin Crane - "When we talk to businesses there is a feeling among many that they have been plagued by uncertainty and rising costs for several years and it is starting to take its toll on them."

New service is all set to pull in

NEXT year - 2026 - will be a massive year for the nation's railway services.

The new Great British Railways brand was unveiled earlier this month as landmark legislation was debated in the commons.

The aim is to get one railway brought back into public ownership to deliver a more reliable network.

Those who have been a regular rail commuter or even just used trains for leisure, will have had your fair share of delays, cancellations and extortionate fees to get where you need to be.

Hopefully all that will change.

A new GBR ticketing app will allow people to buy tickets without booking fees - and this comes after the government's freeze on rail fares to put money back in passengers' pockets.

The GBR ticketing app will be a one-stop shop for passengers to check train times and buy tickets at the best prices across the rail network without any booking fees.

Disabled passengers will also be able to use the app to book Passenger Assist when buying tickets, creating a seamless experience.

Up and down the country, the consensus is clear - the railway needs to improve.

That is why the government is bringing train operators back into public ownership to reform a fragmented system.

Seven major train operators are already in public hands, covering a third of all passenger journeys in Great Britain.

The logo and train livery for GBR will be rolled out from spring 2026 to trains, websites, stations and more - bringing the railway together under one brand owned by the public, delivering for the public, not for private shareholders.

The new brand

The design features a red, white and blue colour scheme and sharp angles to create a striking and memorable design mirroring the Union Flag.

The GBR logo has also been revealed, featuring the iconic double arrow symbol in a nod to Britain's proud railway heritage.

The landmark Railways Bill follows the government's decision to freeze rail fares for the first time in 30 years to put money back in passengers' pockets and ease the cost of living for hard-working people.

The bill will create Great British Railways, which will bring together 17 different organisations, cut through the frustrating bureaucracy and lack of accountability that continues to plague the railways and instead run Britain's railways as a single organisation for the first time in decades.

GBR will maintain and improve the railways, accountable to passengers, freight customers and taxpayers.

Fares and ticketing will be brought into the 21st century (including with the new app), a strengthened passenger watchdog will investigate poor service and demand improvement, and GBR will be empowered



to build a railway that supports the government's missions to drive economic growth and opportunity by unlocking jobs and housing.

A railway for everyone

Transport Secretary Heidi Alexander said the future of Britain's railways was under way

"I'm immensely proud to unveil the new look for Great British Railways as we deliver landmark legislation to nationalise our trains and reform the railway so it better serves passengers.

"This isn't just a paint job - it represents a new railway, casting off the frustrations of the past and focused entirely on delivering a proper public service for passengers.

"With fares frozen, a bold new look and fundamental reforms becoming law, we are building a railway Britain can rely on and be proud of.

Jacqueline Starr, Executive Chair and CEO of Rail Delivery Group, said: "The Railways Bill presents an opportunity to bring the industry together with a single focus on

delivering for our customers and we are determined to play our part in getting it right.

"As the industry evolves, our priority remains supporting the rail network to keep people moving and making sure we are delivering a better railway for everyone across the country, now and in the future.

"We welcome the government's commitment to improving the services our customers depend on every day and we will continue to work closely with industry partners to support a smooth transition to Great British Railways."

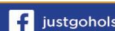

Different ways to ring in 2026

FANTASTIC firework displays have become synonymous with New Year celebrations around the world.

As the clock ticks down to the start of the new year many find themselves looking out for seeing the spectacular displays put on by other countries before turning their attention to the banks of the

river Thames and the skies across London.

In many countries the stunning firework displays are a new addition to celebrations and many traditions still remain in place.

Just across the border in Scotland they celebrate Hogmanay.

The Japanese clean their homes and prepare Kadomatsu or Shimenawa to welcome the god before New Year's Eve.

Buddhist temples ring their bells 108 times at midnight in the traditional Joya no Kane.

The rings represent the 108 elements of hono, mental states that lead Japanese to take unwholesome actions.

New Year's Eve in Colombia is a vibrant and diverse celebration, blending traditions, superstitions, and family customs to welcome the upcoming year with positivity and hope.

New Year's Eve is a time for personal gatherings and community revelry. Many Colombians host house parties, where friends and family come together to share in



the festivities.

In the tranquil countryside, communities come alive with vibrant street-party-style celebrations.

A hallmark tradition involves the creation of El Año Viejo, a scarecrow symbolizing the old year, which is placed atop a bonfire filled with fireworks and as the effigy burns, it signifies the cleansing of the past and welcoming new beginnings. Colombia's New Year's customs are steeped in superstitions and age-old traditions, each carrying its own symbolism and significance.

In Spain they eat grapes at the stroke of midnight.

Tradition has it that people have

to eat them one by one, in time with the striking of the clock at midnight on December 31.

Those who manage to eat all the grapes in time, are said to be in for a year of prosperity and good luck.

In many towns and villages people go to a central square or an iconic place where there is a large clock, to eat the grapes together and share the last minutes of the old year.

In Spain tradition says those who eat 12 grapes in time with the striking clock are in for a year of prosperity and good luck.

The second Lamborghini High Performance Electrified Vehicle (HPEV), Temerario joins the V12

Revuelto HPEV and plug-in hybrid Urus SE to deliver the Italian marque's take on electrification: emissions reduction combined with heightened performance across the range.

Davide Sfricola, who took over as head of Lamborghini UK in 2025 said: "Lamborghini enters 2026 in this market with the most comprehensive hybridized super sports car offering in our segment."

"Importantly, Lamborghini's appeal with our clients, for our models' infamous design and benchmarking performance, is enhanced by our hybridization programme, with technologies making our cars easier and more fun to drive but as emotionally charged as ever.

"This year has witnessed new

products, important customer and public events, and expansion of our UK network, and 2026 will see an exciting evolution of the same."

The UK consistently maintains its place in Automobili Lamborghini's top five global markets, along with the USA, Germany, Italy and Japan currently and, endorsed by an average 12 months' lead-time across its products in the UK and beyond, always retaining exclusivity as a core principle.

This is exemplified by the Urus SE, for which UK deliveries started at the beginning of 2025 and now maintains benchmark residual values in its segment, while in its first full year of production the iconic Revuelto won accolades in 2025 with major automotive media.

The opening of Lamborghini Mayfair in London's most prestigious district marks the UK's twelfth showroom location, with expansion of aftersales facilities in Leeds and Pangbourne. 2026 will see further new dealership representation, serving a growing number of owners with access to sales and aftersales.

Bethell helps England to memorable Ashes test win

CRICKET: WARWICKSHIRE'S Jacob Bethell starred with the bat as England claimed a remarkable victory inside two days in the fourth Ashes test against Australia.

Bethell scored 40 runs in England's second innings to help the visitors to a four-wicket victory at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on his Ashes debut.

The 22-year-old also helped England bring an end to an 18-game winless run in Australia and avoid a series whitewash.

Australia went into the fourth test having already regained the urn for the fifth successive series dating back to 2017/18.

And England brought Bethell into the side in place of Ollie Pope to bat at number three, with the former not involved in any of the first three tests.

However, Bethell has impressed for England Lions on their tour of Australia as he delivered 70-plus scores against Australia A and England respectively.

A difficult pitch for batting saw wickets tumble from the outset of the fourth test as England bowled Australia out for 152 in 46 overs which

included a five-for for Josh Tongue (5-45).

However, England also struggled with the bat and managed 110 all out in reply in just 30 overs as Harry Brook (41) top scored.

Bethell managed a single run from five deliveries in his first Ashes innings as he fell to the bowling of Michael Neser (4-45).

England responded well with the ball to bowl Australia out for 132 in the latter side's second innings despite the best efforts of Travis Head (46).

This left England needing 175 runs for victory as openers Zak Crawley (37) and Ben Duckett (34) set the visitors on their way.

Bethell came in at number four and scored 40 runs from 46 deliveries which included five boundaries.

He eventually fell to the bowling of Scott Boland (2-29) as Brook (18 not out) guided England to a memorable win with four wickets to spare in 33 overs.

Victory saw England triumph in a test match in Australia for the first time since 2011.

The fifth and final Ashes test takes place from January 4 to 8 in Sydney.

In the 55 to 59 race, Andy Jackson finished 16th with Alan Buxcey 18th while Mark Garrett placed ninth in the 60 to 64 race.

And in the senior race, James Garrett finished fourth with Tom Bradley fifth in the 40 to 44 race and Colin Miller fourth in the 45 to 49 event.

Elsewhere, in the Eastern Cyclo-Cross Championships, MI Racing's Richard Perham finished 20th in the men's 50 to 59 race with teammate Ray Cochrane 15th in the 60-plus race.

In the Welsh Cyclo-Cross Championships, husband and wife duo Nick and Lynsey Whitley finished fourth and sixth respectively in the men's 50 to 59 race and women's 40 to 49 race.

And time trial rider Joe Murray, from Nuneaton, won the Veterans Time Trial Association (VITA) Midland series of races.

Murray finished top of the points table based on his best six results across the series with Leamington-based teammate Mark Wise sixth overall.

And Nuneaton-based MI Racing rider Simon Law raced in the Polly Botts Hill Climb in a field of more than 50 riders and finished 14th after the 1.1km long climb.
